What do we provide?

- **Intensive rehabilitation** after a new stroke in your own home, following assessment.
- **Community Rehabilitation.**
- A **review** of your health and social care needs at 6 and 12 months following a stroke.
- A **Stroke Support Service** for people with stroke and their carers, for up to one year after stroke.

Who is in the team?

- Occupational Therapists
- Physiotherapists
- Speech and Language Therapists
- Stroke Support Worker
- Neuro-psychologist
- Rehabilitation assistants

We work closely with other health, social care and voluntary services around your needs.

What do we do?

We will work with you towards agreed goals. We will provide assessment, treatment and advice.

This may include:

- Indoor and outdoor walking practice
- Promoting independence with daily activities e.g. meal preparation, bathing
- Help with communication and swallowing problems
- Assessment for equipment as part of a rehabilitation programme
- Access to the community and practice using public transport
- Emotional support
- Stroke information and advice re stroke prevention
- Support and training for carers
- Advice and assistance to return to work and leisure activities

In Kensington and Chelsea we provide:

- A dysphasia support group (for people with communication difficulties)
- A peer mentoring scheme (people who have had a stroke supporting others who have had a stroke)
